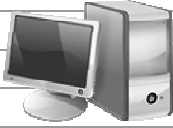
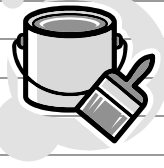


Free Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Disposal

Protect your drinking water source! Instead of putting household hazardous waste (HHW) in your trash or pouring it down the sink or storm drain, let the City of Allen pick it up. Remember...anything that goes down your drain ends up in Lake Lavon—the source of your drinking water.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Examples	
Paints, varnish, coatings (including spray paint)	Cell phones
Chemicals—garden, pool, pesticide, pet	Automotive fluids and batteries
Household cleaners	Gasoline and diesel fuel
Computers and computer equipment	Vegetable oil
Rechargeable and button batteries	Fire extinguishers and propane tanks



HHW items must be in labeled containers (original container is best) with the lids screwed on tightly.

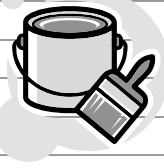

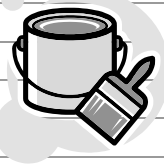
